"Michigan 50 Companies to Watch" is an awards program (list of winners attached) sponsored by the Edward Lowe Foundation and presented by Michigan Celebrates Small Business.

"The 50 companies selected this year give us an inspired view of Michigan's entrepreneurial landscape," says Penny Lewandowski, director of entrepreneurship development at the Edward Lowe Foundation. "These are companies with a history of growth and potential as significant drivers of our economy. Some are expanding through the development of innovation while others are creating new markets. They play a role in their communities as job creators and as thoughtful philanthropists.

Companies nominated for the "Michigan 50 Companies to Watch" list must be second-stage companies, defined as having 6 to 99 full-time-equivalent employees and generating \$750,000 to \$50 million in annual revenue or working capital from investors or grants. In addition, the companies must be privately held and headquartered in Michigan.

Judges from the banking, economic development, entrepreneurship development and venture capital communities selected the winners. The judges evaluated the nominees' demonstrated intent and capacity to grow based on one or more of the following:

- Employee or sales growth.
- Exceptional entrepreneurial leadership.
- Sustainable competitive advantage.
- Other notable factors that showcase the company's success.

Best Small Business – Main Street USA Award: Woodward Auto provides one-of-a-kind automotive service and sales for any kind of automotive need (contact owner John Mihelich at 248-334-6400.) To be eligible for this award the small business must be a client of the MI-SBTDC who participated in a substantial amount of MI-SBTDC programs that resulted in a positive impact on the company in areas such as access to capital, development and implementation of a strategic plan and entry into new markets.

Government Contracting Award: B&P Manufacturing has been engineering material handling products since 1945 (contact owners Gale and Keith Merchant at 231-306-3828.) To be eligible for this award the small business must be a client of a Michigan Procurement Technical Assistance Center (PTAC) and received a minimum of one-year assistance to help the business win or come substantially closer to winning a government contract.

Innovation Award: Evigia Systems is a leading provider of wireless sensing, identification and tracking solutions targeting military, security, and commercial applications (contact CEO Navid Yazdi at 743-302-1140.) To be eligible for this award, a product or service must have been developed and earned revenue during the past three years and be nominated to the Small Business Association of Michigan.

Urban Small Business and Entrepreneurship Award: Proos Manufacturing provides engineering and manufacturing solutions for the automotive, defense and medical supply industries (contact owner Amy Engelsman at 616-293-7653.) To be eligible for this award, the small business must have been located in a designated urban area, be a second-stage business, show evidence of sales outside of Michigan, and demonstrate potential for long-term business success and economic growth.
